Report from altar guild: Karol will call about prices for poinsettias then a sign up sheet will be out. The Sunday School Christmas program will take place during worship on Sunday. December 17th.

Report from Pastor: Liturgy and songs in place for Growing Hope Globally celebration. She is working with Pastor Ted. Reformation weekend is October 28th and 29th. Stewardship and Missions committees will be handing out the Time & Talents Survey. The Thanksgiving Eve service will be held at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church on November 22nd.

Advent Morning Prayer will last three weeks starting on December 5th. On Christmas Eve. there will be a regular Sunday service at 9:45 am and an afternoon service at 4:00 pm.

It was noted that the budget should be changed to reflect the raise in the accompanists' stipends.

Hymns for November were chosen.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 2:02 pm.

# Mõ6 MINUTES 10/3/23

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 by chairperson, Kathy Anderson. Pastor Chris Schoon led us in prayer as we prayed a prayer entitled May God's Spirit Work Among God's People. Present at this meeting were Kathy Anderson, Linda Johnson, Anita Milligan, Pastor Chris, Nancy Miller, and Connie Hamer.

Anita moved and Linda seconded to accept the July minutes as printed. The motion passed unanimously. Nancy Miller then gave the treasurer's report. Nancy indicated that Resource purchased additional stocks for our portfolio on 9/15/23. These were purchased from some of the funds that have been giving us steady and good returns. Scott Horsch still needs to be put on as a secondary signature on the MOG accounts. Monies are still being received from the Hilliard, Voss, and Eighner funerals. When asked, Nancy responded that she spends about 1 ½ to 2 hours monthly on the MOG finances. Kathy reminded us that we will need to give the St. John's audit group our books when they are ready to do the church audit. Connie moved and Anita seconded to accept the treasurer's report as printed. The motion passed unanimously.

There was no old business. Current Sunday School funds, vacation Bible School funds, and church picnic bills have all been covered.

Under new business, Pastor brought up that St. John's is purchasing a new Hewlett Packard laser/copy machine. Difficulties with the current machine have been going on for about a year. She asked if MOG was willing to help with this expense. The new machine costs \$800 and the toner cartridges cost \$250 (4 needed). Nancy said we have \$5700 in unspecified funds. Connie Hamer moved and Anita seconded to give St. John's \$1800 toward the purchase of a new laser/copy machine and toner cartridges. All were in favor. That leaves \$3910 in the unspecified funds.

Connie will complete the annual MOG report (due in early Dec.). Several names were recommended as a possible new members and we will ask those people. The 2024 annual meeting is scheduled for Sunday, January 21<sup>st</sup>. MOG meeting dates for 2024 are: <u>Tuesday, January 2nd, Tuesday, April 2nd, Tuesday, July 2nd, and Tuesday, October 1<sup>st</sup></u>.

There being no other business, we adjourned at 7:43 p.m. by praying The Lord's Prayer.

# **STEWARDSHIP MINUTES 10-4-23**

The Stewardship meeting commenced at 8:50 with a prayer asking that the Holy Spirit unite us in common mission, shared life, and justice. Present were: Lynn Skrzypiec, Pastor Chris Schoon, Karol Grandgeorge, Mike Hamer, and Connie Hamer. There having been no September meeting, the August minutes were approved as printed.

CROP Walk was held at St. Paul's in Hinckley on October 1<sup>st</sup>. Mike reported that he took \$720 from our congregation (current total) and that the walk seemed to go well. Pastor reported that Nancy Fraley said they had gathered over \$14,000 for CROP. We may be the site for the 2024 CROP.

Growing Hope Globally is scheduled to begin with worship at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, Oct. 21<sup>st</sup>. Set-up will be on Friday, Oct. 20<sup>th</sup>.

Karol reported that 568 school kits were delivered to Elgin on Sept. 14<sup>th</sup>. Three vehicles driven by Karol, Wayne and Cindy Karp, and Steve Schoon made the delivery. We need 4 oz. bars of Ivory soap for Baby Care kits. Sunday school and Confirmation students have been asked to contribute.

Karol also reported that Heidi Eaton will not be setting up the LSSI Giving Tree, so she and Julie Horsch have taken over the task. They chose 10 teens, 25 young children, and gift cards for this year. We will put up the tree after Bible Study on Oct. 26<sup>th</sup> as the project must be completed by November 26<sup>th</sup>. We are not certain of a pick-up or delivery date currently.

We believe Mark Lee has the drivers he needs for Meals-on-Wheels in November.

Pastor Malindabigwe will not be coming to St. John's as his appointments are all filled.

Connie will write the Safe Passage article for Dec., as well as the yearly report,

and 2 Stewardship calendars.

Connie, Karol, and Pastor Chris will meet on Thursday, Oct. 12<sup>th</sup> after Bible study to draft a commitment letter and review our member list. Mark and Michael will do the mailings by Monday, October 30<sup>th</sup>.

Lynn will research NI Food Bank schedules and volunteers for participation.

Pastor and Mike will talk with the council on the 12<sup>th</sup> about any changes on the Time and Talent Brochures. We will pass them out on Reformation weekend, Oct. 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup> at 8:45 a.m. We closed at 9:47 a.m. by praying The Lord's Prayer.

# The Parents Corner

Like most of us, my life has been a continuous cycle of learning and teaching. The 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> chapters of the book of Revelation tell of error in the practices of six churches formed to worship God as Creator, Savior and Holy Spirit. Straying from truth was easy, especially when people could not read God's word for themselves. Following the invention of the printing press and translation of the Bible into common languages, people became aware of how much error occurred in doctrines of church and rules of government.

I was privileged to acquire a tome containing photos and reprints of letters, speeches, prayers and governing documents in this country from the early 1600s to the mid-twentieth century. From it, I learned that our northern Atlantic seacoast was settled by people seeking a place to worship God without fear of reprisal for beliefs that sought to correct error. A gift to me this year was "The American Story" by David and Tim Barton. The events and ideas described in it are familiar to me through my previous reading.

Long ago, when I attended Sunday School, I loved the singing. I wonder if children still learn one of my favorites. "The wise man built his house upon a rock." We sang the beginning verse loudly, but we sang the second verse even more so, and when "the house built on the sand went crash!", we shook the rafters. We also learned a vital truth at the same time. God is our rock in time of trouble.

For most of the years I taught Sunday School, we studied the Gospel of Mark but took a side-trip to Ephesians 6:10-17. Instructions to put on "the whole armor of God"... the belt of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, shoes to take you to proclaim the gospel of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God... creates a powerful image for students and encouragement for adults.

So, onward Christian soldiers. Put on your armor to save our God-Blessed country and ourselves.
