Jerry and Toni Lundeen presented to the council their idea of hosting a gourmet dinner prepared by a professional chef on February 22nd to raise funds for Growing Hope. They asked for permission to use the church facilities, tables, and flatware. All other dinner and cookware will be provided. The dinner will be limited to 100 guests. Council granted them permission.

Connie presented devotions on the fruits of the spirit.

- ⇒ Scott reported that St John's made a payment to three Lutheran churches in Peru with our noisy offering collection.
- \Rightarrow The preliminary budget was presented.

- ⇒ An honorarium line item was added for VBS leaders.

- ⇒ There was discussion on whether a parsonage landline is needed.
- ⇒ Drew will investigate whether to use Nexamp as our electric provider.
- ⇒ Council agreed to pay Anita Milligan for filling in as a supply pastor.
- ⇒ Drew made the motion to adjourn. Mike seconded. Meeting was adjourned at 11:58.

News from St. John's Committees

Example Stewardship/Mission Minutes 11-6-24

The November meeting was called to order with the following present: Pastor Chris Schoon; Karol Grandgeorge; Mark Lee; Lynn Skrzypiec; Mike Hamer; and Connie Hamer present. The opening prayer was about "going out into the world with peace."

The October minutes were approved as corrected. Lynn's last name was misspelled.

Mike's October offering report was as follows: General Fund - \$11,551.04; Capital Fund - \$963.04; LWR Shipping Fund - \$500 (total now \$1110.97 without matching from Endowment); Good Samaritan - \$134; Hurricane Disaster Assistance - \$265; Sharing Pantry - \$500; and Growing Hope Globally - \$1523.61.

Mark set up the Meals-on-Wheels drivers for November. Thanksgiving week delivery is only Mon-Wed.

Upcoming Community Feasts: Karol reported the following information. The next gathering is Sunday, November 24, 2024 at the United Church of Sandwich with the ecumenical service to follow. St. John's is responsible for 10 hot vegetable dishes which will be picked up by 3:00 that day. Salem reported that they fed 90 and gave leftover food to Open Door. The minutes from the wrap-up meeting are in the secretary's notebook. Our date to host will now be Tuesday, February

25, 2025 and then in November '25 (date and time to be set later). Because this event is advertised to the public, we need a DeKalb County Health Department permit (\$55), which must be posted at the event. In house gatherings (ex. funerals) do not require a permit. Other sanitary requirements are in the meeting notes.

Salem Church goes to the Northern IL Food Bank on the third Tuesday of each month. The shift is from 9:00a.m. to 11:30a.m. You must sign up with your phone # and e-mail address 3 weeks ahead of time. For example, for the Dec. 17th date, you must sign up by Dec. 1st. Salem leaves at 8:00 a.m. and welcomes riders or you may drive yourself.

The Lutheran Social Services of IL (LSSI) Giving Tree will be set up by the confirmands this evening. We have received 18 names with 3 requested items per name. Gifts must be returned to our church by Dec. 1st. Monetary donations are always welcome if you can't shop.

Connie will write the article for our December emphasis which is Safe Passage in DeKalb. Connie will also write the annual report and do the 2025 calendars.

No new LWR information currently.

CROP had a successful drive according to Mark and Mike. Their goal was to reach \$17,000.

Karol brought up another opportunity for community involvement. We Are Called To Care is an agency in Plano which supplies needed items for foster children. They are currently renovating a home in Yorkville where kids can stay until they are placed in a foster home. They are trying to fund raise \$27,000 to purchase a van for transporting the children. They are designating the 2nd Sunday in Nov. as 'Pure Religion Sunday,' and asking folks to "stand up for the vulnerable." Their website is CAFO.org/pure religion.

December 7th will be our St. John's progressive dinner. It was wonderful last year, so please come!

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, Dec. $4^{\rm th}$. We adjourned at 10:00 a.m. by praying The Lord's Prayer.



DeKalb County Safe Passage

Dear Congregation,

St. John's continues to support worthy local organizations and charities whenever possible. Safe Passage has been our December emphasis for many years. Safe Passage (SP) is Dekalb County's *only* Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Crisis Center. As per their website, their mission is "to promote the right of all to nonviolent and abuse-free relationships through advocacy, intervention, and prevention. SP is funded through state and federal grants, private donations, and the support of some local agencies. SP was founded in 1981 as a grassroots non-profit organization run by volunteers who wanted to create a safe place in the community for victims of domestic violence." Their services include crisis intervention; emergency shelter; long-term transitional housing; case management; counseling; legal and 24/7 medical advocacy; community prevention education; and offender intervention services. All survivor services are completely free, confidential, and available to all no matter age, gender, or when the abuse occurred. SP's vision is a world without violence where all are safe. They focus not only on the victims, but also on interrupting cycles of harm. As mentioned in previous articles, SP is attempting to build a new facility. They now have the property, and the existing building on the new property was demolished. They are currently working with an architect whose drawings will be certified by House and Urban Development. After that, bids for construction will be available. They must have 80% of their funding before they can receive a loan.



When our daughters were in elementary school, there was an epidemic of mumps. Although they were in different classrooms, they came down with the mumps at the same time. My mother assured me that I had the disease as a child, so I was safe. I cared for them and felt so badly for them. The fever made them thirsty, and swallowing was painful. The day they were well enough to go back to school, I came down with the mumps. In childhood, only one side of my throat was involved and my left side glands swelled hugely. I learned that sympathy is a long way from empathy. I hadn't treated my girls nearly nicely enough.

A couple in our congregation lost all they owned when their house burned to the ground. They know the joyful relief that their loved ones got out of the house safely and years later, they still speak of the people who rallied to their support while rebuilding. But even they do not know what would have happened if there had not been a community to help because they also had lost everything, as in places in our country today.

This December, as we pray "Thy will be done", think of a young girl facing pregnancy, the loss of her betrothed and the approval of family and friends who then sang, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,".

Can we do the same?

Organizes activities, publicize events and coordinate participation. Please join us in any way that works for you.


