# Stewardship/Mission minutes 12–4–24 🚥

The December meeting began at 8:50 a.m. with Mike Hamer, Karol Grandgeorge, Pastor Chris Schoon, and Connie Hamer present. The opening prayer was about our "greatest gift ever" – Jesus!

Connie completed and submitted the following: Safe Passage article, Stewardship annual report, Mission calendar, and Stewardship task calendar.

Michael reported that he had only one request for new offering envelopes and that person agreed to change their giving number, so he did not need to order any new envelopes.

We received a final report on CROP (see report in secretary's notebook). They fund raised \$21,254.02. Of special interest were their combined efforts with Rosati's, Culver's, and Star 34.

Michael's November offering report was as follows: General Fund - \$15,291.09, Capital Fund - \$1,026.44, and LSSI - \$245.95 (total now \$1345.95 with Endowment gift). Karol and Connie will purchase additional gift cards with the funds.

Karol will write the January emphasis article for Outreach and Fel-

lowship/Hospitality committees.

Community Feast – Our turn for hosting the community feast will be Tuesday, February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025. We have decided on ham for the main meat, and we will also do the cold salads. Those foods will be made on site. We will be contacting Phyllis Whitehead (UCC Sandwich) and Marilyn Wouda (Salem Lutheran of Sandwich) as to their involvement. A small committee will meet on Wednesday, January 8<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m. to discuss details such as warming appliances for hot dishes, set-up, etc. We will apply for the temporary DeKalb County Food Establishment permit at the end of January.

LWR update: Another roll of diaper flannel was purchased.

The meeting adjourned at 9:40 a.m. by praying The Lord's Prayer.

# MLK on what really matters

Exactly two months before his assassination, Martin Luther King Jr. preached his final sermon at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta. On February 4, 1968, the civil-rights icon spoke about how he wanted to be remembered at his funeral. He preferred that people recall not his education or achievements but that he "tried to give his life serving others" and "tried to love somebody."

Adapting a 1952 homily by J. Wallace Hamilton, King decried the "drum major instinct — a desire to be out front, a desire to lead the parade." Humans often want to be great and first, as evidenced by the disciples James and John requesting prime seats in paradise. But King urged listeners to focus on the "reordered priorities" of Jesus, who wants us to "be first in love."

As Jesus showed, "everybody can serve," King said. Your background or status doesn't matter, as long as you have "a heart full of grace" and "a soul generated by love."




