- ♦ Joanne read devotions based off the book of Luke. God's presence is through Jesus who is our greatest gift.
- ♦ Wayne called the meeting to order at 11:12
- ♦ Jerry Lundeen, representing the Call Committee presented the Ministry Site Profile. The committee worked hard at forming and completing a nice document. Jerry asked for guidance regarding salary. It was suggested to offer synod guidelines. Jen Beamsley our synod rep has accepted a call. Jen Henry is our new rep.
- ♦ Motion to approve Ministry Site Profile presented by Jerry Lundeen, Chair Person of the St. John's Call Committee. To be submitted to NI Synod. First Connie, Second Joanne, All Approved. No Opposed. Motion Approved.
- ♦ Cindy made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Connie seconded. Consent agenda was accepted.
- ♦ Scott presented the treasurer's report.
 - ◇ Church finances are healthy
 - ◇ More gifting compared to last year at this point
 - ◇ Scott emphasized that 80 percent of our expenses are staff and property related.
 - ◇ Scott presented a preliminary budget for 2026. Joanne moved to approve a 4% increase for all staff wages for the year 2026. Connie seconded. Motion passed.
- ♦ Committee reports
 - ◇ Fellowship/Hospitality – The annual Christmas dinner went well.
 - ◇ Outreach – There have been a few young adult visitors attending recently.
 - ◇ Finance – None
 - ◇ Missions/Stewardship – See report. Bob shared an offer from the Sharing Pantry to increase their monthly donation because of rising utility costs. The council agreed to accept their offer and suggested a \$25/month increase. LWR quilters have decided to not quilt on Tuesday evenings anymore and may move the day to not interfere with the Sharing Pantry.

 - ◇ Parish Education – All good
 - ◇ Property – More work needed to be done at the parsonage than originally presented. The final bill was \$3400 as opposed to \$1200.
 - ◇ Worship – See report
 - ◇ Tech – The copy machine needs servicing. A motion was made by Cindy to receive copier lease estimates. Joanne seconded. Motion carried.
- ♦ Wayne reminded everyone to have their yearly reports in to the office by Christmas.
- ♦ Cindy made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Connie seconded. The meeting was adjourned at 12:18

Connie completed the Safe Passage article, the Stewardship annual report, the task calendar, and the 2026 emphasis calendar. Karol will write the article for our January emphasis which is St. John's Outreach and Fellowship & Hospitality Committees.

Michael's November offering report was as follows: General Fund - \$12,024.15; Capital Fund - \$1344.41; Altar Guild - \$150; Good Samaritan - \$100; Kitchen Fund - \$700; Meals-on-Wheels - \$300; LSSI Giving Tree - \$406.37; and Sharing Pantry - \$625.00.

The Growing Hope Gala is scheduled for Saturday, February 21st at St. John's.

LWR news: Cindy Karp currently needs 12 & 18 month t-shirts. Our February emphasis is Personal Care Kits and the 5 items needed has not changed at this time – 1 bath towel, 1 nail clipper, 8 oz. of bar soap, 1 sturdy comb, and 1 toothbrush.

The LSSI Giving Tree mission was completed. We collected gifts for 18 people and additional gift cards from various vendors totaling \$1925. Kathy Hall picked up the offerings on Dec. 3rd.

The Fellowship Community dinner held at St. John's on Nov. 23rd went well. We served 90 for the meal and 95 were at the worship service. The meal was chili, corn bread, salad, various casseroles and desserts.

The shortest Stewardship on record was adjourned at 9:01 a.m. by praying The Lord's Prayer. Our next scheduled meeting is Wednesday, January 7th.

Dear Parishioners,

Throughout the year, our Mission/Stewardship Committees emphasize different charities or organizations that St. John's supports. In previous years, we took a supply gathering for Midwest Shelter for Homeless Vets in January and a monetary donation in August. This year, we decided to combine the supply and monetary donations into one month, June. MSHV is a non-profit agency that provides housing, supportive services and community outreach to help homeless and at-risk veterans and their families achieve self-sufficiency. Founded in 2007 in Wheaton, IL, by 2 veterans, MSHV operates on the vision of no veteran left behind due to homelessness, joblessness, poverty, and/or mental health issues. MSHV desires to ease suffering for veterans and their families and to empower veterans to become productive members of their communities. MSHV is a not for profit 501(C)3 organization and their non-profit tax ID # is 36-4337985 (for your tax purposes).

We will be accepting supplies throughout the month of June, and the door offering the week-end of June 26th and 27th.
