There are many jobs that need to be completed to get things ready for packing. I know we are all busy doing many things throughout the year, but can you give a little time to the LWR causes?

  - ♦ MOG There was an \$800 money donation to purchase oil filled candle holders. Lynn Skrzpiec is going off the committee with Jerry Lundeen coming on. A portion of the committee bylaws were rewritten to allow Nancy Miller to remain financial secretary but not as a voting member. It was presented to council. Connie made a motion to accept the rewritten bylaw. Cindy seconded. Motion carried. Now it will move on to the congregation for approval.

## STEWARDSHIP/MISSION MINUTES 1-8-25

The January meeting was called to order at 8:48 a.m. with Mark Lee, Karol Grandgeorge, Pastor Chris Schoon, Connie Hamer, and Mike Hamer present. The opening prayer was asking for God's presence, insights, and wisdom.

The December minutes were approved as printed.

Michael's December offering report was as follows: General Fund - \$43,187.91; Capital Fund - \$1054.04; Safe Passage - \$430.08; Good Samaritan - \$533.00; and LSSI - \$100.

Michael still has about 25 offering envelope packs for anyone needing new envelopes.

The emphasis for January was our Outreach and Hospitality committees. Karol will put information about the February emphasis which is LWR Personal Care Kits in her monthly LWR article. Each personal care kit has five items: 1 bath towel, 8 oz. soap,

1 nail clipper, 1 toothbrush, and 1 sturdy comb. Karol will purchase the towels, soap, and toothbrushes for approximately 150 kits (from funds already available) to complete kits with supplies left over from last year. We will put out the display in late January for our congregants. Other LWR information: A new roll of flannel for diapers has

arrived. LWR monthly workdays for 2025 were set and Diane will put out a few pamphlets with the quilt top packets for those interested. Also, Karol and Connie made a trip up to Elgin on Thursday, January  $2^{nd}$  to deliver the LWR kits and quilts that had accumulated.

There will be a meeting to discuss details for the Community Fellowship Dinner scheduled for Tuesday, February  $25^{\rm th}$  from 4:30 p.m.-6:00 p.m. at 10:00 this morning.

Mark and Connie will not be available for the next scheduled Stewardship meeting, so we have set the February meeting for \*\*\* Wednesday, February 12th, at 8:45 a.m. \*\*\* Stewardship usually skips the month of March for a meeting, but Connie will submit an article for the March journal for our March emphasis which is our Sunday School.

A reminder that March 5<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday and Easter is Sunday, April 20<sup>th</sup>.

Twenty Rectangular tables and four Round tables were purchased for \$2944.92 (this cost was under budget).

After discussion, the Financial Secretary's position updates to the bylaws we slightly revised. Karol motioned and Anita approved to accept the updates to the bylaws. The vote was unanimously approved. Kathy will update and submit them to the Church Council for approval.

Discussion was continued regarding scholarships for voice or piano lessons with Jessica Ortega. We will find out further information about cost of lessons.

A monetary request was made to purchase refillable candles for the Advent Wreath (four taper candles and one pillar candle for the center), and a refillable Paschal Candle. The cost will be approximately \$820. Anita motioned and Karol seconded to purchase the refillable candles. The vote was unanimously approved.

Jerry Lundeen will be joining the MOG Committee. His term will be from January, 2025 to January, 2030.

Anita motioned and Pastor Chris seconded to adjourn the meeting. The committee adjourned by praying the Lord's Prayer together.


