We would like to thank everyone who has brought in Personal Care Kit items and those who have given money. We have purchased some items and will be able to purchase more! Thanks again.

Lutheran World Relief is celebrating it 80th Birthday this year. Just think of all the quilts and kits that have been sent to vulnerable people in those 80 years. In 2024 alone 370,818 quilts, 140,117 School Backpacks, 45,690 Baby Care Kits, 127,621 Personal Care Kits and 5,568 Fabric Kits were distributed in 16 countries. What an accomplishment for those that work countrywide for Lutheran World Relief!

January during work days we will be cutting school bags and getting the packs ready for people to sew at home. There will be blocks to cut for the Piece Maker packets which go home to be sewn into quilt tops. The sewn quilt tops will be matched with a center and a back so they are ready for the tiers. Happy fingers will tie the quilts and pin the edges. Then the quilts will be sewn around and folded so they can be packed for transport to Elgin. We put together things that have come in for the Baby Care Kits so they can be sent. There are many jobs that need to be completed to get things ready for packing. I know we are all busy doing many things throughout the year, but can you give a little time to the LWR causes?

GOD'S WORK, OUR HANDS!

- Pastor led devotions based on Matthew Chapter 10 calling us to travel light and not carry our burdens and grievances.
- Wayne called the meeting to order at 10:49 and introduced our three guests from "Our Sharing Pantry".
- "Our Sharing Pantry" update on their current situation and needs.
 - ◊ Number of families has increased 64 percent in the past year, from 394 to 648 families. Since August numbers have steadily increased to an average of around 80 clients/month. Half of their clients are senior citizens.
 - ◊ Receive food and toiletry items from the Northern Illinois Food Pantry, the State Emergency Food Assistance Program, and the U.S. Government Commodities Program. They received a DeKalb County grant to get items from local farms.
 - ◊ The inventory they are allowed to purchase from the NI Food Pantry is based on previous numbers of needy families. The numbers have not caught up with the current need increase, not allowing them to keep up with demand.
 - $\diamond\,$ Since November they have been calling on the community to bring awareness to their situation.
 - \diamond They have dropped their budget by \$12,000.
 - $\diamond\,$ They are requesting better signage, possibly using an \$800 grant they recently received.
 - ♦ They thanked our church for both our financial support and providing a home for the pantry.
- Wayne welcomed JoAnne and Mary to the council.
- Connie made a motion to approve the consent agenda items, Cindy seconded, motion approved.
- Scott presented the treasurer's report. Our giving contributions since the beginning of the year were more than our expenditures which is good. We basically need 18 to 20 thousand dollars a month to run the church. He reminded the council to always be aware of where our money is being spent. Pastor had a question as to some money contributions and whether they should be directed to MOG. Scott said he was aware of it and was waiting for various reasons.

 - Or Property Ward said he would be able to change over all the lower lights to LED, but not the higher ones in the fellowship hall. Bob agreed to work with Donna Fraley from the Sharing Pantry on better signage.

BERBERGE STEWARDSHIP/MISSION MINUTES 1-8-25

After several changes in meeting dates and times, the February Stewardship meeting began at 10:11a.m. with Karol Grandgeorge, Mike Hamer, Pastor Chris Schoon, and Connie Hamer present. The opening prayer stressed that God has made us stewards of all that he created and that He asks us to use our gifts wisely, share generously, and bear witness to the love of Jesus Christ.

The January minutes were approved.

Mike's offering report for February was as follows: General Fund - \$12,783; Capital Fund - \$573.50; Cuzco, Peru churches - \$179.55; MSHV - \$50; and Personal Care Kits - \$561.77 (2025 total - \$1166.49).

Articles for upcoming events: Connie completed the Sunday School article for the March emphasis and will put Blood Drive reminders in both the April and May newsletters. Karol will write the Capital Fund article for April.

LWR – We have packaged over 200 Personal Care Kits as of today. Since that line item is currently very healthy, we will order more Personal Care Kit items to be completed in June when we have gotten through Lent, Easter, and several other upcoming events.

The Community Fellowship Dinner served 79 people. We had two full hams left over, approximately 2 desserts + cookies, and 4 pans of hot dishes. Salem is responsible for the May dinner, United Church of Sandwich for August, and St. John's again in November. The November dinner will be on Sunday, Nov. 23rd followed by the ecumenical service at our church. The menu will be determined later.

Lenten soup/supper meals are all set up. Meal donations are going to Our Sharing Pantry. Karol will shop for crackers, margarine, and paper plates. Meals are served from 5:00 to 6:00 with the services starting at 6:30 p.m. using Holden Evening Prayer. Congregational church is contributing desserts on several evenings.

On Tuesday, March 11th, we are hosting the South Conference Spring Assembly at 6:00 p.m. The chili will be made by Pastor Chris, Karol, and Wayne Karp.

Our commitment of pastries to the Lenten Prayer Breakfasts at the Sandwich Federated Church on March 12th will be organized by Jackie Harmon, Nancy Maroscia, and Glenda Andrews.

***Because of conflicts with the Lenten Prayer Breakfasts, the next Stewardship meeting will be <u>*Tuesday, April 1st at 8:45 a.m.*</u> We adjourned at 11:01 a.m. by praying The Lord's Prayer.



As many are aware, St. John's has special door offerings (emphases) each month. We would like to continue with our Sunday School for our March emphasis. Your past generosity has been greatly appreciated and has lifted some of the financial burden from the staff. They are truly amazing, dedicated, folks who are frugal and wise in using the funds. Nancy Miller reports that they continue with the 1-room schoolhouse format with the help of confirmand and high school students. Their current curriculum is from Oriental Trading with a shared teacher's guide and printable handouts. In addition, the teachers seek out a free online video which supports the lessons. She reports that they continue to study the parables and miracles of Jesus: the Christmas story; the 10 Commandments; and the Books of the Bible.

They are also trying to involve the children within worship services on a regular basis. Next, they are gearing up for Lent and Easter. Following that will be VBS (Vacation Bible School – July 21st-24th) and Rally Day in the Fall. Once again this will be our March emphasis.

Stewardship <u>does</u> check with Pastor and Council annually when making changes to our emphases so that we can direct funds where they are needed most.
