Dear Council Members and Members of St. John's Lutheran Church, Somonauk, Illinois

Greetings to you in the powerful name of Jesus the Christ!

I begin this letter with a reading from Ecclesiastes Chapter 3 where the writer says that everything has its time:

3:1 For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

.....4 a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance;

5 ... a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;

6 a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away;

7 ... a time to keep silence, and a time to speak(NRSV)

This Scripture is sometimes used at funerals. But it is also applicable today, therefore I add - A time to arrive and a time to depart.

Dear Friends in Christ, I am announcing my retirement from active ministry in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and at St. John's Lutheran Church, Somonauk effective August 31, 2025. My last Sunday will be August 24.

This has not been an easy decision. Steve and I have been thinking about and discussing my retirement for some time. After much prayerful discernment I felt this is the appropriate time for me to retire.

You, the members of St. John's, will always hold a special place in my heart. It is my fervent prayer that you will continue walking with God here in this place called St. John's, Somonauk. Rest assured the Northern Illinois Synod Office will faithfully lead you through the process of receiving an Interim Pastor and then a new called Pastor. Over the next three months, we will have time to share stories and celebrate God's work together. At the congregational meeting on June 8th, you will have



the opportunity to organize a Call Committee.

I began my ministry here at St. John's in January 2019 as your interim pastor and was called to serve as your pastor later that same year. We have been together through many highs and lows and for that I give thanks. It has been an honor and privilege to serve as your pastor. May God guide and bless these days of holy and sacred transition.

We want to thank everyone for their donations to the Baby Care Kits during the month of May. We try to do 20 Baby Care Kits each month, so that means at least 40 t-shirts are being used each month. The t-shirt can be long or short sleeve- sizes 12 month, 18 month, or 24 month(2T). We always love seeing the beautiful colors and prints that t-shirts come in. We cannot use sleeveless shirts or onesies.

Work days in June will be used for cutting school bags and getting the packs ready for people to sew at home. Someone can match baby patchwork tops with material to make a small quilt for the Baby Care Kits. These small quilts are also tied. We will cut blocks for the Piece Maker packets which go home to be sewn into quilt tops. These tops are matched with a center and a back when they are returned, so ties can be made on them. The ties hold the layers together and then they are stitched around. After sewing, they are packed in boxes to go to Elgin and later transported to New Windsor, Maryland. We also put together items for Baby Care Kits. There are many towels that have been purchased that need the paper tags removed so we can make more Personal Care Kits. Needless to say, there are always many jobs to be completed, so come spend some time with the LWR workers!

The April minutes were approved as read.

Due to several members not available in June, our next scheduled meeting will be Wednesday, $July 2^{nd}$, 2025 at 8:45 a.m.

Michael's offering report was as follows: General Fund - \$14,938.44; Capital Fund - \$1058.41; Good Samaritan - \$122; Habitat for Humanity - \$631.13 (current total); St. John's Local Benevolence - \$500; Sharing Pantry - \$1294.13.

Mark is setting up drivers for June Meals-on-Wheels. Connie will take June $24^{\rm th}$ - $27^{\rm th}$. We do not need to do Mondays as someone else is covering those.

Michael attended the CROP meeting. Our Savior's will be hosting the event on Sunday, Oct. 5th with walking to be at the Fairgrounds. They will continue with partnering with local restaurants and having the Tip Jar at the Fairgrounds. Cindy Frasier is the contact person.

LWR update: May's emphasis is Baby Care Kit month. Karol put it in her monthly article and reported that more diaper flannel has been ordered. Cindy Karp is <u>ALWAYS</u> in need of t-shirts sized 12 months to 24 months (2T).

The Blood Drive is scheduled for Thursday, June 5th from 2:30-7:00. Mark will work 2:00-4:30 and Karol from 4:30-7:00p.m. Connie did sign-ups at church May 3rd & 4th; Michael will do May 10th & 11th; Karol will do May 18th; and Connie will do May 25th. Connie will make phone calls and Julie will put out a blast to St. John's members. Approximately 20 flyers will be distributed to: FVOAS; Som Library; Bethany (Leland); United Church of Sandwich; Our Savior's Sandwich; Salem Lutheran; St. Paul's (Sandwich); St. John the Baptist; Federated Church; Baptist Church Som; Union Congregational Church; Rambos; Bud's Citgo; Doug's; Art's; Pancake House; Country Kitchen, Casey's; and J.C. Fitness.

Our emphasis in June is Midwest Shelter for Homeless Vets. Connie will

put up the display at the end of May.

The May Community feast is on Tuesday, May 27th at Salem Lutheran. We are responsible for 10 desserts which need to be at Salem by 4:00p.m. or here to be delivered by 3:00p.m. United Church of Sandwich will host the August 26th feast. At that time, St. John's will be responsible for 4 – dinner casseroles; 4 – veggie dishes; and 4 – potato dishes. We will host the November 23rd dinner. At the end of the year, a decision will be made whether to continue with the dinners.

Our August emphasis is children's charities. Some suggestions are Somonauk #432, We Are Called to Care, or LSSI. We will consider whether to split the funds between organizations or to choose just one.



Dear Parishioners,

As it has been for several years, St. John's emphasis for June is Midwest Shelter for Homeless Vets (MSHV). MSHV is our opportunity to lift and THANK those who have given so much for us. Founded in Wheaton, IL by 2 veterans, Bob Adams and Dick Enger, MSHV operates on the vision of no veteran left behind due to homelessness, poverty, joblessness, and/or mental health issues. This non-profit agency provides: affordable and transitional housing; permanent supportive housing; support services for vet families; GPD case management; employment programs; and the freedom commissary. MSHV desires to ease the suffering for veterans and their families and to empower them to become productive members of their communities. Their efforts in this regard are evident in that they are serving fewer households (over 500 in a 13 county area) than a couple of years ago. Vets must meet lifestyle and income requirements for some services. MSHV is a non-profit 501(C)3 organization and their tax ID# is 36-4337985 (for your tax purposes).

St. John's will be accepting supplies and monetary donations (made out to St. John's and marked MSHV) throughouthe month of June.


