The Good Samaritan Fund -Our August Emphasis

As many of you are aware, St. John's usually has a mission emphasis each month. At Stewardship Committee's February meeting, we made changes to that emphasis schedule due to our church income and budget cuts. We kept some of the missions (LWR), but changed a few. This year's calendar was changed as follows:

February - LWR Personal Care Kits

March - Sunday School

April - Capital Fund

May - LWR Baby Care Kits

June - Midwest Shelter for Vets

July - Worship/Altar Guild Comm.

August - Good Samaritan fund

Sept. - LWR Shipping fund

Oct. - CROP Walk & Growing Hope

(formerly Foods Resource Bank)

Nov. - LSSI Giving Tree

Dec. & Jan. - not decided yet

The Good Samaritan Fund was our emphasis in August of last year and we kept it as it is a local fund to help the immediate, but temporary, needs of transient travelers and disadvantaged local residents.

<u>Aid:</u> The available aid is limited to the monies in the fund through vouchers. Long term or greater needs are addressed through other

community programs. No individual or family receives its benefits more than once a year. Local residents normally receive a food/gas voucher and/or infant needs voucher. Transient individuals normally receive a food/gas voucher or meal voucher. Process: All requests are normally initiated from one of the local participating churches.

A signed pastoral recommendation then goes to the Sandwich Police Dept. (308 E. College). With proper identification, the police assess the needs, approve the vouchers, then sign and date them. Vouchers are not honored without that signature. The Sandwich Police Dept. maintains the records to ensure compliance and merchants forward vouchers to the Sandwich/Somonauk Ministerial Assoc. for reimbursement.

We will be accepting donations for the GSF during the month of August. As always, please make certain that your donation is marked <u>Good Samaritan Fund</u>. Many, many thanks to all who assist in keeping our mission work strong.





News from St. John's Committees

Stewardship/Mission minutes 7-5-23

The meeting was called to order at 8:51 am with Mike Hamer, Pastor Chris Schoon, Karol Grandgeorge, Connie Hamer, and Lynn Skrzypiec present. Pastor led us in prayer asking that God help us to use His gifts wisely and to share them generously.

The June minutes were approved.

Karol reported on LWR projects. Karol and Mike delivered our recent quilts and kits to Elgin on June 28th. The date of <u>Sunday, August 20th</u> was chosen to fill school bags. School kits: There will be 2 extra days for sewing school bags on August 1st and 2nd. There are other tasks that people can do that day other than sewing - banding pencils and pens, stringing bags, opening supplies, etc. Michael reported that the Walmart supplies for 400 bags should be in by the end of July. Baby Care Kits: Cindy Karp is in need of 9 month T-shirts and 18-24 month jackets. No fleece or sherpa for infant clothing. The most recent roll of diaper flannel was delivered.

Michael's offering report for June was as follows: General Fund - \$14,949.34; Capital Fund - \$1,027.73; MSHV - \$747.53; Baby Care Kits - \$75.

The June Blood Drive was a success! We had 21 people who signed up to give and the final number of units was 14 - 3 no shows; 2 deferrals; and 2 rejected. Next year's Blood Drive is scheduled for June 6th.

Nancy Miller would like the children's Sunday School to have a monthly service project next year. For example, Ivory soap could be collected one month for Baby Care Kits or diapers for the Diaper Pantry.

Connie will do an article for the August emphasis which is the Good Samaritan Fund.

Connie will deliver the MSHV supplies collected to Wheaton on Thursday, July 6th. The phone number is 630-871-8387 ext 3.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, August 2nd at 8:45 am.

Elected several members to serve on Synod Council and committees.

Heard from Bishop Fidlar on new initiatives including a partnership with Southeastern Iowa Synod

MAG MINUTES 6/27/23

The regularly scheduled meeting for July 4th was rescheduled for a week earlier as July 4th is a national holiday. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 by chairperson, Kathy Anderson. Nancy Miller led us in prayer using a daily devotion, as Pastor Chris Schoon is currently on vacation. Present at this meeting were: Nancy Miller, Lynn Skrzypiec, Anita Milligan, Linda Johnson, Kathy Anderson, and Connie Hamer.

Kathy passed out the agenda. Anita moved and Linda J. seconded to approve the April minutes as read. All were in favor. Nancy passed out the treasurer's report (see attached report). A few of the investments have shown some loss due to market instability, but it is nothing to be concerned about at this time. Other than fees to Resource bank, there have been no other expenditures. The Money Market minus designated funds gives us \$73,733.12 available funds, with the reminder that we have decided to not spend more than \$10,000 annually. Nancy is also working on adding and deleting authorized signatures with the bank. For example, Scott Horsch, St. John's current treasurer's name, will need to be added.

Nancy Miller has continued to be treasurer, but is not a voting member.

Another piece of old business was forming a yearly spending plan. After much discussion, it was decided to keep the \$10,000 possible annual budget fluid. Rather than assigning a percentage to various possible projects, we will discuss projects as they are presented and make decisions as to funding them at that time.

We do not currently have any requests. Some possibilities for funds are the Hospitality Committee for the church picnic, vacation Bible School, or Sunday School programming and supplies. We will be kept updated on these issues during the next few months.

There being no other new business, Connie moved and Anita seconded to adjourn.

We adjourned at 8:51 pm by reciting The Lord's Prayer.

- 5-UNSHARPENED #2 pencils with eraser
- 5-black or blue ballpoint stick pens(no gel pens)
- 1-2 ½" eraser

The bags will be in the Welcome Center by July 30th so you can take some and fill them. School supplies are out in the stores, so shop soon. If you can not go shopping, you may help by putting your contribution in a blue envelope and marking it School Bags. We thank you in advance for any help you can give. Last year we did over 520! What will we get done this year?

On Sunday, August 20th at 5:00 pm, we will be filling the remaining backpacks and packing them all in boxes for transport to Elgin, so they can go to the LWR center in Maryland. After we pack all the boxes, we will then enjoy pizza. As you can see, there are many opportunities to help, so come as often and as much as you can! We Lutherans like to eat, so there is a strong possibility of treats!
