ATENTION: On Tuesday, August 5th and Wednesday, August 6th, we are having School Backpack Workdays. The backpacks will need to be strung, more backpacks sewn, school supplies taken out of the packaging and pencils and pens need to be rubber-banded together. We will be working from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm each day. Then on August 17th, we will meet at 4:00 pm to fill the backpacks and pack the backpacks for shipment. Please put these dates on your calendar!

Yes, August is School Back Pack month at St. John's. We will be packing them on the 17th of August, so shopping needs to be done soon. The school supplies are out so here is the list:

- 4-70-sheet spiral notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper, 8" x 10 ½"
- 1-30-centimeter ruler or ruler with centimeters and inches
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 pair of **blunt** scissors (not pointed scissors)
- 5 <u>unsharpened</u> #2 pencils with erasers
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1-2 ½ " eraser

If you are unable to shop, please place your donation in a blue envelope or with your regular offering and mark School Backpack. We will shop for you! All Backpacks will be completed by the 31st of August.

Regular work days will be used to make quilts and baby care kits. Some Piecemaker packets to be sewn at home will be made as well as any work that needs to be done on the remainder of backpacks. Come help on the regular work days and the special days so we can have a lot of backpacks done again

St. John's Lutheran Church Council Minutes - July 6, 2025

- Members present: Pastor Chris Schoon, Bob Fraley, Connie Hamer, Scott Horsch, Cindy Karp, Wayne Karp
- ♦ Cindy gave devotions based on Psalm 131. Worry less, pray more, and trust God by putting all things in his hands.
- ♦ Wayne called the meeting to order at 9:56.
- ♦ Connie made the motion to approve the April and May minutes and the April, May, and June check details. Cindy seconded. Consent agenda was approved.
- ♦ Scott presented the Treasurer's report.
 - ♦ As of June 30th our envelope contributions are at 46.23% of our budget.
 - ♦ We spent \$2100 more than what we took in this past month.
 - Our June income was \$13,660.17 which was lower than our target of \$18,000/month.
 - Scott pointed out possibly reviewing our insurance coverage to try and lower costs.
 - Our total assets at this point compared to last year stand at \$35,570 more.
 - ♦ Scott noted we have \$32,584 in building fund contributions.
- ♦ Committee reports
 - ◆ Fellowship/Hospitality: Picnic is August 3rd. There will be a Sunday social in the Fall.
 - ♦ Outreach: None
 - ♦ Finance: None
 - ♦ Missions/Stewardship: See report
 - ♦ MOG: Two people from Resource Bank came and talked about investments. They review it regularly and recommended keeping it the same. Two new communion tables were purchased.
 - ♦ Parish Education: Pastor asked about how adult forum will move forward after she leaves. There are 14 kids signed up for Vacation Bible School.
 - ♦ Property:
 - Pastor presented a job list presented by Ward which included...
 - X Stone cleaning
 - × Parking lot resurfacing and striping
 - **x** East awning needing maintenance
 - × Repair balcony walls
 - × Replace carpet
 - × Upgrade light clusters in sanctuary to LED
 - × Repair floor tile in kitchen and bathroom
 - × Wooden entrance doors need repair
 - Pastor recommended painting the parsonage when they leave. There is some storm door weatherstripping needing repair.
 - Bob painted outside metal doors and front railings. Sharing pantry has purchased new signage.
 - Connie asked if there are Sunday School rooms available to use as LWR storage.
 - The cemetery purchased a five-year supply of flags and hired a contractor to spray for weeds and fertilize.
 - ♦ Worship: See report
 - ♦ Tech: None

- ♦ Pastor's report: See report. Pastor asked if she and Steve could purchase her office's PC when they leave. It was taken under consideration.
- Wayne presented an estimate for repairing cracks, sealcoating, and striping the parking lot for \$3230. Connie made a motion to accept it. Cindy seconded. Motion carried.
- ♦ Wayne said that the executive committee and Pastor met with Jennifer Beamsley on Wednesday July 2nd. Jennifer said that she currently has an interim in mind who is discerning the decision. She said we are living in a math problem with 400 pastors retiring last year and only 180 students graduating from seminary. Connie asked about the possibility of sharing a pastor and Wayne expressed many options are open. Jennifer will meet with the council on August 17th.
- ♦ A call committee needs to be established. Names were presented as possible candidates.
- ♦ Cindy made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Connie seconded. Meeting was adjourned at 11:05 and closed with the Lord's prayer.

August Emphasis: Children's Charities

Dear congregation,



As you are aware, every month we choose one or two charitable groups for monetary or in-kind donations. In addition to LWR school kits (which you can read about in the LWR article), we have chosen to split monetary donations in August between two groups which assist children:

Somonauk #432 Elementary and Lutheran Social Services of IL (LSSI).

Specifically, we are asking that the funds be used for supplies or food for children.

LSSI is one of the largest nonprofit, statewide social providers and has been serving IL since 1867. Their mission statement is: Responding to the Gospel, LSSI brings healing, justice, and wholeness to people and communities. They placed 2,647 children with foster families last year. Somonauk Elementary often finds itself supporting students with basic needs. Their social workers often have this sensitive information.

STEWARDSHIP/MISSION MINUTES 7-2-25

The July Stewardship meeting was called to order at 8:46 a.m. with Pastor Chris Schoon, Karol Grandgeorge, Mike Hamer, and Connie Hamer present. We prayed asking that God's Spirit work within us.

The May minutes were approved as read.

Michael's offering report was as follows: General Fund - \$13,656.91; Capital Fund - \$1,029.41; Kitchen Fund - \$1,196.30; MSHV - \$482.50; Baby Care Kits - \$574.90 (YTD); Sharing Pantry - \$167.52.

Lutheran World Relief (LWR) updates: Karol and Connie took 2 van loads of completed quilts, personal care kits (372), and baby care kits to Elgin on July 1st. Church of the Brethren, whom we have depended on to transfer completed projects to Maryland, will be closing that program by the end of the year. We will be noting any news for that concern as the year progresses. One of our two emphases in August is LWR school kits. We will have 2 workdays for school kits on Tuesday, August 5th and Wednesday, August 6th from 9:00-3:00. We especially need folks to string the bags with cord. On Sunday, August 17th, we will actually fill the bags with school supplies starting at 4:00 p.m. Michael will order enough supplies to fill 450 bags.

Meals-on-Wheels was completed for June.

Connie will take the Midwest Shelter for Homeless Vets supplies to Wheaton on July 3rd.

The June blood drive collected 7 units + the several that were donated and credited to St. John's drive on other dates. We have not received a total at this time.

The May Community Feast at Salem Lutheran in Sandwich served 75-80 people. United Church of Sandwich will host the August 26th meal. At that time, St. John's will be responsible for 4-potato dishes, 4-dinner casseroles, and 4-veggie dishes. We will host the November 23rd feast. The decision will then be made whether to continue with the project.

Besides the LWR school kits, our other August emphasis will be monetary donations for James R. Wood Elementary (Somonauk) and LSSI. The donations will be for food or supplies for children. Connie will write the article. Look for the July emphasis article in our newsletter for Worship and Altar Guild Committee.

We adjourned by praying The Lord's Prayer. Our next meeting is Wednesday, August 6th at 8:45 a.m.



Parents Corner

While visiting my apartment, my daughter, Anita, asked her grandson, Woodland, if G.G. (that's me) knew what was on the front of his shirt. I looked and said, "That's Mickey Mouse!" Woodland replied "That's right, G.G.!" I thought he was not only experiencing positive enforcement in his life, he was learning to give it.

Then I silently laughed at myself, thinking such a modern and dry phrase instead of more descriptive and old-fashioned words like "approval" and encouragement." My mom almost always gave me approval, even though she was my disciplinarian, but my dad's approval was hard to win. The highest grade given in my school was "S" for Superior. When I brought my report card home with "S" for every single subject, dad asked why I didn't get "S-plus". I felt crushed... Until I discovered dad's high school course book tucked between two books in our library, and I realized he had to be kidding me. Sometimes that was hard to tell with his dry humor.

Mom always encouraged me to try new things. I was no athlete, but I could run fast and joined a YMCA track team. The first event I participated in was a relay race and I was the anchor leg. By the time I got the baton, all the other teams had crossed the finish line, which was where my coach was jumping up and down shouting "Run, Lois, Run!" There have been times in my life when that memory has spurred me to not give up and not give in.

The Holy Spirit that Jesus sent to us gives us constant love and encouragement when we falter. I listen to it because the Bible tells me so.


