Because May is the month of Mother's Day, we will be emphasizing Baby Care Kits. For a Baby Care Kit we need:

Lightweight cotton t-shirts Sizes 12 month to 24 month

Gowns or sleepers <u>without feet</u> Sizes 12 month to 24 month Can also use 2 -piece pajamas <u>without feet</u>

Light weight jacket or sweatshirt Size 12 month to 24 month

Stocking caps for infants

Socks Size 12 month to 24 month

Light weight Hand towel (dark color preferred)

1 ¼ yard of flannel (Will be made into blanket at church)

All items must be new or like new with no stains or rips. Any donations should be put in the hamper which is in the hallway by the kitchen. If you would like to make a monetary donation, please indicate that on your regular offering envelope or on a blue envelope.

Work days in May will be used for cutting school bags and getting the packs ready for people to sew at home. We will cut blocks for the Piece Maker packets which go home to be sewn into quilt tops. These tops are matched with a center and a back when they are returned, so ties can be made on them. The ties hold the layers together and then they are stitched around. After sewing, they are packed in boxes to go to Elgin and later transported to New Windsor, Maryland. We also put items together to make Baby Care Kits. There are many towels that need the paper tags removed so we can make more Personal Care Kits. There are always many jobs to be completed, so come spend some time with the LWR group!

# Parents Corner

When my daughter and her family were living in a Mississippi city on the Gulf of Mexico, my husband and I went for a visit. While there, we went to dinner at an elegant restaurant beside the water while the sun was setting. We were dressed in our finest clothing. The two boys wore white shirts and small ties. Before and during our meal, their parents quietly explained what was happening and how to behave. They were very young gentlemen.

When I was in high school, our football team was undefeated for the public league championship. We were going to meet the best Catholic League Team for the city championship. Our principal, Mr. Seney, called an assembly to remind us how Fenger students were to behave whether we won or lost. No cat calls. No rioting. We were to rise above provocation. Our team played to a tie and lost by the toss of a coin. At that outcome, we went home quietly just as we did the next year when the same thing happened.

This preparation and aspiration was followed in the school our daughters attended, and in our family.

There are standards of behavior in life, especially for followers of Christ. Our guide and our encouragement come to us in the book of God, our Bible. Sometimes these standards may be difficult for us to follow. After all, we are called to love one another despite our differences and our faults.

God help us.
