The Call to Worship

P: Welcome to the celebration!

C: **We come to proclaim what angels proclaimed on the first Christmas. Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace to everyone!**

P: Welcome to Christmas, and God's table. Welcome to the supper of love, and the celebration of new life in Jesus.

C: **We come to worship the Christ. This baby of God is the Messiah for the world and the Savior of us all.**

P: We begin our worship in the name of God our Creator, Jesus, our Savior, and the Holy Spirit.

C: **Amen!**

Christmas Confession and Forgiveness

P: Let us come into the light of Christ, confessing our need for God's mercy.

A brief silence

P: God of peace,

C: **we confess that we are not at peace—with others or with ourselves. We bring to you all that tears us apart: discord in our families, violence in our world, our own conflicted hearts. In your mercy, mend us. Reconnect us to one another and to you. Let peace reign over all the earth, through the Prince of peace, our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.**

P: In the Word who has come to dwell with us, God has given us grace upon grace: forgiveness that is stronger than our sins, love that can heal every broken heart. Hear this word of God's pardon and peace: in the name of ✝ Jesus our Savior, you are free from all your sins. Rise, shine, for your light has come.

C: **Amen.**

ELW 240 Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah

While Reader is speaking – light the 4 outer candles of the Advent Wreath

Reader: As we celebrate the birth of Jesus and rejoice in His coming to us, we light the Christ candle. Jesus Christ is our hope. He is our peace. Jesus Christ is our joy. He is love-- pure, holy, undying love. Whoever believes in Him will never perish but have eternal life (John 3:16). Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift! (2 Corinthians 9:15)

Eucharistic Prayer

P: Gathered at and around the Lord's table, we remember with thanksgiving that *"In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: 'Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.'* Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: *'This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.'"*

Candle Lighting

ELW 281 Silent Night, Holy Night

all verses v. 1-3

As you receive the light, please pass it to your neighbor. When passing the light, please tip only the unlit candle. To avoid burns and spilled wax,

lighted candles should be held vertical at all times.

Reader: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light: those who lived in a land of deep darkness – on them the light of Christ has shined. Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify our Father in heaven.
