





Introduction

Assisting Minister1: Listen to this overview of the readings for the day. Perhaps the church, at its best, is "all ears." God urges the faithful, again and again, to "listen up!"—to heed the word that gives life. So it was with Abraham and Sarah, Mary and Martha, and the early church at Colossae. So it is today as we join the assembly to hear the word of God, the word of life.

The **First Reading** comes from the Book of Genesis Chapter 18 verses 1-10a Assisting Minister 2: A First Reading introduction: The Lord visits Abraham and Sarah to

tell them that the long-awaited promise of the birth of a child will be fulfilled for them in their old age.

Assisting Minister2: Hymn Story

Thomas Obediah Chisholm was born in a log cabin in Franklin, Kentucky in 1866. He received his education in a little country schoolhouse, and at age 16 began teaching there. He became a Christian at age 27, and with no college or seminary training was ordained to the Methodist ministry at age 36. He served as a Methodist minister for a year, but ill health made it impossible for him to continue.

Always interested in poetry, Chisholm wrote hundreds of poems during his lifetime. He was inspired by Lamentations 3:22-23 to write the text for "Great Is Thy Faithfulness." Those verses read, "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Assisting Minister1: Hymn Story

Arabella Katherine Hankey (1834-1911) was born into a family both devout and prosperous. As to religion, they were Anglicans

At age eighteen, Kate moved to London to teach a Bible class for factory girls, and continued that work for more than a decade. Then at age thirty she became seriously ill. She was forced to cease work and endure bed rest for a year. During that time, she wrote a very long poem—one hundred verses.

Upon hearing Kate's poem, Wm Doane was inspired to use part of it as the basis for the hymn, "Tell Me the Old, Old Story."

Later, William Fischer did something similar with another part of Kate's poem. The result was the hymn, "I Love to Tell the Story."

Assisting Minister2: Hymn Story

Joseph Scriven was born in County Down, Ireland. Scriven moved to Canada. Scriven received word that his mother was ill. He couldn't afford to return to Ireland, so he sent his mother a poem in the hope that it would comfort her. The poem began, "What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer!"

This hymn has maintained its popularity for a century and a half—probably because Scriven was acquainted with faith—which helps us to see that faith can triumph over all kinds of obstacles.

Assisting Minister1: Hymn Story

This one-verse hymn is also known as Doxology. The word doxology comes from two Greek words, doxa, which means glory, and logos, which means word. So a doxology is literally "a word of glory." We sing doxologies to give glory or praise to God. This doxology was written by Thomas Ken, an Anglican clergyman. Ken was born in 1637, and was orphaned at an early age.

When Ken was fourteen years old, he entered Winchester College, and four years later began studies at Oxford. He later returned to Winchester College as the chaplain to the bishop.

Ken was one of seven bishops who refused to sign King James' *Declaration of Indulgence*. For this act of rebellion, he was arrested and imprisoned in the Tower of London—but he was later tried and acquitted. He died of natural causes in 1711.

The Apostles Creed

Assisting Minister2: God has made us his people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
