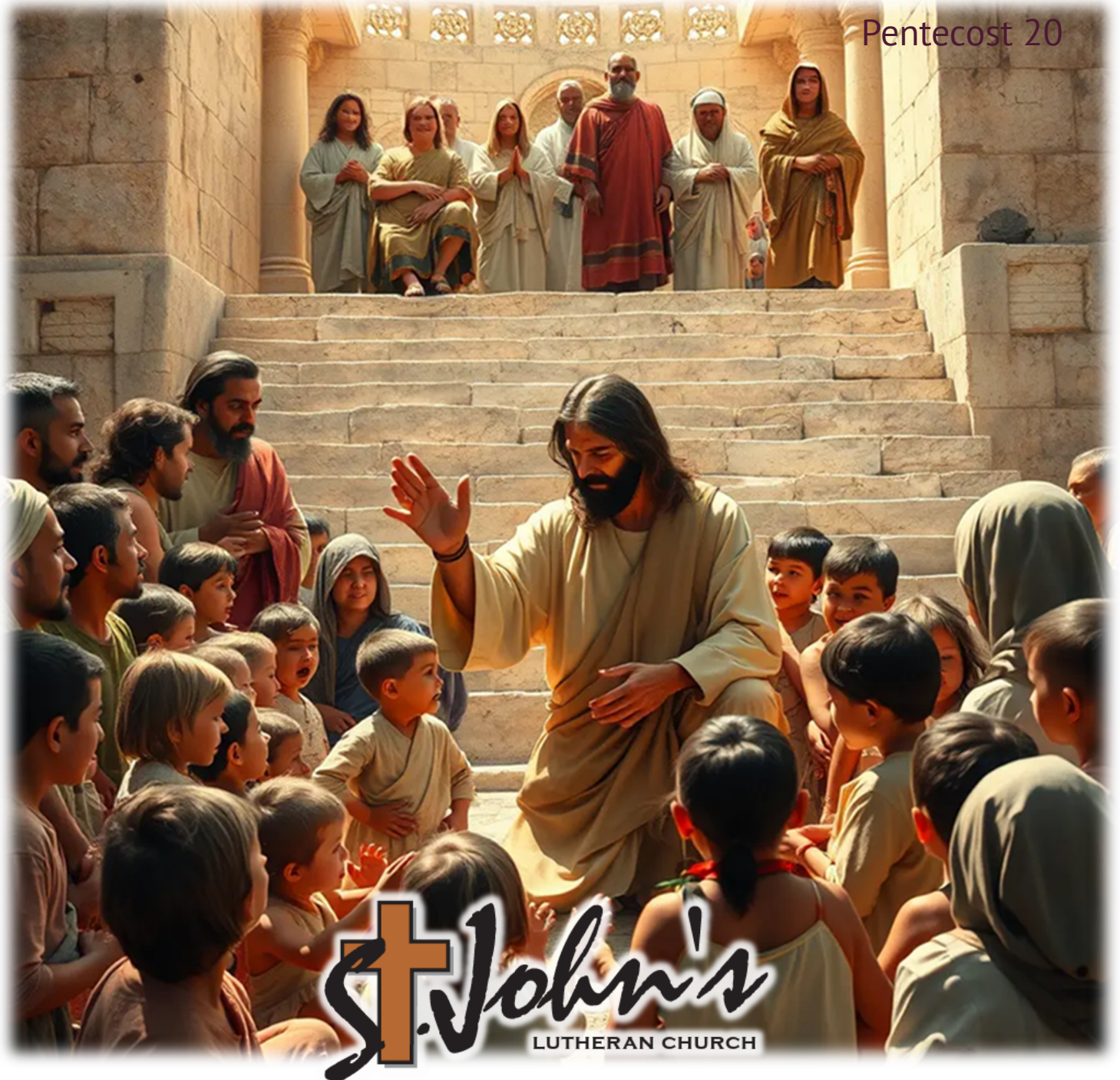

Eucharistic Prayer
