

Hymn Sing ¹

ELW 504 v 1& 2 A Mighty Fortress is Our God

Martin Luther was an Augustinian monk; his understanding of the Christian faith was radically reshaped by his reading about faith and grace in the book of Romans We think that this hymn was written at Coberg, Germany. This hymn became Luther's battle-cry. Its theme comes from Psalm 46, which says:

"God is our refuge and strength,

a very present help in trouble.

Therefore we will not fear,

though the earth should change,

though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea;

though its waters roar and foam,

though the mountains tremble with its tumult"

(Psalm 46:1-3)

Luther wrote thirty-five + hymns altogether. This hymn is by far the most familiar.

ELW 812 v 1 & 2 **Faith of Our Fathers**

This hymn, written by Frederick Faber in the 19th century, obviously has to do with Christians suffering persecution -- and the inspiration that their heroic witness gave to their fellow Christians. Indeed, we are always inspired by stories of Christians who maintain their faith in the face of persecution or death. Persecution has been a part of the church's life from the very beginning.

Pray for Christians who endure persecution -- to make ourselves aware of their stories -and to be inspired by their heroic witness.

"Faith of our fathers! living still In spite of dungeon, fire, and sword; O how our hearts beat high with joy * * *

ELW 656 v 1 & 4 Blest Be the Tie That Binds

John Fawcett was born into a poor family in Yorkshire, England, and was orphaned at age 12. To survive, he accepted a lengthy apprenticeship to a tailor. Then, while still in his teens, he heard the great George Whitfield preach and became a Christian.

At age 25 (and newly married) he was invited to serve as pastor of a small church at Wainsgate. The poor people of that little village were able to pay very little, and much of Fawcett's pay came as potatoes and other produce. Once his wife, Mary, began having children, they found it difficult to survive.

Fawcett, who wrote a number of hymns during his lifetime, wrote this hymn, "Blest Be the Tie," to convey his sentiments and those of his wife to the poor people among whom they had chosen to live. Fawcett served that little church for the rest of his life -- 54 years in all.

ELW 856 v 1 & 3 How Great Thou Art

Carl Boberg was a Swedish lay preacher who, among other things, published a Christian newspaper. He wrote the original version of this song in 1886, and entitled it "O Store Gud," which means "O Great God." His inspiration for the song came from the beauty of Swedish meadows and lakes after a thunderstorm.

Stuart Hine, an English missionary, heard it, translated it into English, and added one or more verses — inspired, he said, by the beauty of the "woods and forest glades" of the Carpathian Mountains after a thunderstorm. The last verse, which begins, "When Christ shall come with shout of acclamation, and take me home," was inspired by Eastern European refugees who had fled to England and who asked, "When are we going home?" Hine printed his version of the song in leaflet form, and it was distributed somewhat widely in England.
